Hong Kong, 23 April 2010 - Hutchison Global Communications Limited ("HGC"), the fixed-line operation of Hutchison Telecommunications Hong Kong Holdings Limited (Stock Code: 215), today announced its winning of the "Best International Wholesale Carrier" Award in the 2010 Telecom Asia Awards. This award is a testimony to the remarkable achievements of HGC in developing total telecom solutions for international carriers on a wholesale basis, and its unrivalled market leadership position.

Telecom Asia is a reputable telecommunications magazine. Presented by Telecom Asia every year since 1998, Telecom Asia Awards are Asia's largest and longest-running telecoms industry honours. This is their 13th year of showcasing Asia's top telecommunications companies in recognition of their accomplishments and contributions. HGC attains a global reach with an Asian focus through the deployment of multiple submarine and terrestrial cable systems offering a high degree of resilience, as well as the establishment of its own point-of-presence (POPs) nodes overseas. Today, HGC's advanced voice, data and IP network links its home market with the rest of the world and carries traffic between internationally-dispersed geographies. HGC was the first operator in Hong Kong to have established direct telecom links to mainland China. With its self-built fibre optic cable systems at Lok Ma Chau, Man Kam To, Lo Wu and Hong Kong-Shenzhen Western Corridor, HGC makes the first player in Hong Kong to integrate four cross-border routes with the networks of all three mainland

China's tier-1 telecom operators. In the voice space, HGC has established interconnections with more than 200 carriers and extended mobile coverage via direct connections with 100-plus operators throughout more than 50 countries. In addition, its international video-routing platform connects with some 60 locations and 130 operators around the world.

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
